HUMAN RESOURCES

For this edition of the Erban Report, I thought I would share with you some of the highlights that our Human Resources team has accomplished and are currently working on:

- I am very proud to announce that The Erb Group of Companies was once again recognized as a Best Fleet to Drive For. Over 200 fleets throughout North America were nominated for this prestigious award, and only 20 winners! Thanks to everyone who completed a survey and contributed to this award.
- In response to requests for better, more timely communication at all Erb locations, we are bringing back our video messaging system on the TV monitors at our terminals. The TVs will continuously display various messages and announcements on a rotating basis.

- The Federal Pay Equity Act came into force on August 31, 2021, and we posted our Pay Equity Plan on October 29, 2021. The plan outlined the steps required to be compliant with the new Act and that Erb will be following over the next three years.
- We have been training staff and managers on the new Federal Workplace Harassment and Violence Prevention Regulations. The regulations outline the new process employers must follow when a workplace harassment or violence complaint has been made.
- The Fall/21 driver safety meetings concentrated on accident preventability awareness, no-fault insurance, and the cost of accidents. The meetings were well received by the drivers who attended.
- HR has created, implemented and held management training sessions. These sessions provide new managers and seasoned veterans with updates on Erb policies, employee relations, Federal labour standards, etc.

- In conjunction with the Bell Let's Talk Day, Erb used the month of January to remind employees about mental health and the various supports that are available to help. Please keep in mind that Erb provides eligible employees, and their family members access to our Employee Assistance Program (EAP). Contact Human Resources if you would like more information.
- We are looking at ways to simplify our local P&D driver pays. We recognize that driver pay methods are not always easy to understand and follow, so we are considering several different methods that we would trial with selected terminals.
- We have a Retention Committee that was formed last year, and they have been working diligently on various ways to enhance employee retention. They thought a good start was to create an employee engagement survey to obtain feedback from employees. Look for information about this survey later this year.
- Our Recruiting Department did a fantastic job hiring a total of 349 new team members in 2021. This total included 81 Erb Transport Limited and 64 Erb International Inc. drivers and owner-operators. Great work!

As you know, the Canadian and U.S. governments both recently implemented the requirement for commercial truck drivers to be fully vaccinated to cross the Canada / U.S. border. While we certainly understand that this created concern for some drivers, out of a total of 288 Erb U.S. qualified drivers, 259 (90%) provided proof of being fully vaccinated, and the other 29 transferred to our Canadian division had their U.S. qualifications removed or retired. Thanks to all our U.S. drivers for the challenging jobs you do.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all of our valued team members; you have led the way during this way too long pandemic by providing an essential service to all North Americans. We have you all to thank for "Bringing food to our families' tables." Also, if there is one positive thing that the pandemic has done, the public has a much greater appreciation for truck drivers and trucking in general. Thanks to all of you, our excellent team of professionals who have helped with this.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

In mid-January, Wendell's update communicated the decision not to go forward with our planned TruckMate software implementation. I like to look at the TruckMate journey as an eye-opening learning experience that led us to the path where we ultimately needed to be. With all of Solomon's quirks, we know it moves our freight better than any system we could buy because... we built it to work within our complex way of moving freight.

Over the years, we had continued to tweak and make changes to Solomon to improve it as we saw fit at the time. And because of that, it made our system very complex, making it very difficult to transition from Solomon to another system. With the decision to remain on our current platform, we had to ask ourselves, "What was Solomon missing that made us look for a new TMS in the first place?"

After several meetings and discussions with departments impacted the most by this, we developed the "Solomon Improvement Project or "SIP" plan. The first priority project of the SIP is to create our own customer load tendering web portal. With TruckMate, we had a web portal and many customers on it. We were averaging 250 orders per day. So, by going back to Solomon, we understood that we needed to continue giving these customers this ability, and we encourage more to also use this portal.

At the time of writing this article, our IT development team has been working very hard on this portal, and it is in the testing phase. The new portal, which is actually built on our Erb Interactive, is even better than the TruckMate version because it is more automated, reducing data entry time for our Customer Service team.

We have a long "wish" list of items to work on to improve our system, and our development team will be focusing most of their available time on this list. The list consists of automation of Solomon within the back office from reducing paper printouts, imaging improvements, more EDI automation, better revenue, and cost capturing, to name a few. As we progress with improvements to the back office, this will carry on into improvements in operations, dispatch and integration with our maintenance software. We are excited to see where we can take Solomon in the coming months and years!

Since my last article, we have had some new faces join our IT team. I'd like to formally welcome Cameron Emmett-Hodge on the helpdesk, Ruchi Bhavsar and Chris Fox on the development team.

FLEET MAINTENANCE

Interesting Comments Heard at the Baden Shop Counter.

It is my pleasure to spend time listening to drivers and vendors at the service counter on a regular basis. Drivers speak with shop staff and alert them of concerns they have about The Erb Group's equipment and other vital challenges in the world! The number one focus is always safety; no matter the business pressures, safety and safety concerns are always dealt with as a serious concern; they take precedence over all else.

We have a monitor mounted on the wall in that area that tracks all the Erb power units across North America, they track detailed locations and monitor vehicle faults. No matter the vehicle make, braking system, electrical system, engine or transmission, if there is a system fault code generated, our shop team can track it. They can track the code number, the importance of the code, and they can identify the next steps for operations and repairs.

I recommend you check it out next time you're in; it's absolutely worth seeing — a very Cool Move!

We also have a sign mounted on the way in with BIG letters, which states a motto we live by, "Do Not Make a Mountain out of a Mole Hill." Here are some tips for common truck safety concerns we get at the shop.




Recent comments have ranged from: "I need new winter blades" to "these just do not clean well or last." Wiper blades like the windshield need to be cleaned now and then. Taking a paper towel and wiping the edge with vinegar works great as a cleaning agent. Unfortunately, the tacking agent put on the roads to make salt stay in place on travelled sections does a great job on the roads to make the salt stick and does the same to the windshield and blades. A bit of effort at a fuel stop will enhance your safety and maximize the wiper blade's return costs: this works on cars and trucks!

"According to this tag, I need a re-torque, was the job not

done correctly? How far can I go before getting this done?" This process is a recommended industry practice that came to light back in the early 1990s when several wheel separations on major highways caused deaths to motorists travelling innocently on their commutes. There were several recommendations by the Coroner's Inquest; the re-torque is one that has stuck and remains a very credible process.

It really is more of a torque check than a re-torque check. Checking to ensure the wheel fasteners are still tight is essential. Slight movement on a couple of fasteners on a wheel shouldn't be a significant concern, but major movement on several fasteners would be cause to disassemble the wheel fasteners and start over with the installation procedure.

Don't even get me started on the old Stud Pilot-style wheels with their directional threads and multiple fastening components. The recommended distance to travel before a torque check is 150 kilometres. If you get to that distance on the road, please do not stop and call road service for a torque check; drive to the shop, and the service will be provided. This distance is a guideline, not a critical distance. If there was an issue in the fastener clamping torque, you would feel or see it at the wheel end. If there is no issue, please drive to the next convenient position for that torque check.

A loose wheel will show rust streaking off the stud with a steel rim and black oxidation streaks off aluminum rims. The safety nut holder (orange connectors) that we utilize in the fleet holds nuts in place and will flex if there has been nut movement; torque checks can be done without removing the safety tabs for a quick turnaround on torque checks.

"I need my fifth wheel moved around. I was heavy on the steer axle on the last load." Erb has developed the fifth wheel locations for the best possible weight distribution on our tractors for the majority of the loads and configurations within our fleet. As several of you know, we have different kingpin placements on some trailer groups; that six-inch difference will have minor weight transfer when comparing loads and axle weights. Our customers' needs do not always align with what our equipment can legally haul or scale to meet axles or axle group maximums. Fuel on board is a critical component of the gross vehicle weight and what weight is on which axle. Burning fuel contributes to the diminishing load aspect as you travel. We have a fivehundred-pound overage variance for all the tractors. The battery-powered APU is equipped with the anti idle feature and seasonal flexibility with winter snow and ice build-up. Also, depending on how the next trailer will be loaded, there could be a need to facilitate moving it back. I suggest, go with what we know, meeting the company policy is the best policy!

"I need the sliders lubricated on this trailer; they are dry, and when I want to slide it, the tires slide on the pavement." At Erb, we want the sliders to be dry. That is how they are meant to work; lubricant will attract dirt that will grind into the slide material and cause more friction with long-term damage. The parking lot or drop yard surface material and the loaded weight have a major impact on the

process of sliding bogies to meet the legal requirements of the jurisdiction you are travelling in or through. Put a wheel stop in the direction you are attempting to slide the bogie or put it up against a well-anchored parking barrier or curb to compensate for the wheels sliding on a surface with a low coefficient of friction.

"I need the rear doors replaced on this trailer I can not close them; they do not line up." Unless physically damaged, doors do not get replaced. More so on new trailers with tight door seals or units that have had door seals replaced recently, there can be a struggle to get the doors to close together. Generally, one will be higher and one lower. I recommend pulling the wheels on the lower side up on a 4 x 4 piece of wood with no nails or screws in it, and that will transfer the alignment of the trailer body and align the doors. It may take more than one attempt or looking at the alignment move off the wood to align the doors.

If you hear someone with a concern about Erb Equipment specifications, service, repair, or operation, please have them contact any Erb shop, and it will be our pleasure to answer their concern or get them the answer if we do not have it handy.

A new year, a renewed focus on financial wellness, and how to build long-term financial resilience and security in a dynamic economy.

Interest rate increases and Inflation

The Central banks around the world are positioned to tame persistent inflation by increasing interest rates. Economists predict the Bank of Canada will gradually increase the overnight lending rate by up to 1% over the next 12 months. Should this happen, banks and lenders will likely follow suit with similar rate hikes on mortgages and loans.

What does this mean?

Higher interest rates will further increase the cost of living, and generally reduce consumer spending.

Ex/ Assume a household has a current variable rate mortgage of \$500,000, 5-year term, interest rate of 1.55%. The household is currently paying \$2.011.45 per month (principal + interest). Over the 5-year term this will amount to \$35,548.43 paid in total interest.

If the mortgage rate increases by 1%, to 2.55%, the effect on this household will be: monthly mortgage payments will increase to \$2,255.69, an increase of \$244.24 per month. The total interest paid over the 5-year term will be \$59,072.04 or an additional increase of \$23,523.61!

Now may be a good time to review any variable rate mortgages and prepare for increased borrowing costs on upcoming mortgage renewals or other financing.

2022 Market Outlook

The Central Bank's emergency stimulus is ending and so we will likely experience some near-term volatility as market conditions shift. While the Omicron variant is concerning, it should not stop the global economy's recovery. Economists suggest fundamentals and corporate earnings remain healthy. Inflation will likely cool, as supply chain disruptions ease, but will settle at a higher rate than we had pre-pandemic.

Regardless of where we are in the market cycle, it's important to take a disciplined approach to investing and stay focused on your long-term financial goals.






BBQ & ESSENTIALS

ERB GOOD CHEER

SUP-ERB AWARDS

A SUP-ERB Award is given to Erb employees who go above and beyond their normal duties in a specific capacity. If you think someone is worthy of an award tell us so we can reward their exceptional act of SUP-ERB-ness!

EMPLOYEE REPRESENTATIVES TO MANAGEMENT COMMITTEES

The employee rep committee is made up of elected full-time employees from major departments, specific to each terminal of the company.

The purpose of the committee is to strive for favourable working relations between department supervisors, employees and management in handling problems or grievances for a smoother operating Erb Group of Companies, except where negotiating wage rates and benefits are concerned. It will also protect and advance the interests of company as well as the employee. The committee meets once each month at their terminals.







If you have a grievance, problem or suggestion please let one of your terminal employee representatives know so it can be discussed at the next meeting.

SAFE DRIVER PROGRAM

The Erb Group of Companies has recognized the efforts of our drivers in safe driving through the Infrastructure Health and Safety Association - Safe Driver Award Program. This program recognizes and awards professional drivers who have proven their skills in avoiding accidents with a safe driver pin and card. To qualify for the Safe Driving Pin, the driver must be full-time and must have worked at least nine months of the year in an active driving capacity. The company also enhances this program by offering a bonus.

REFERRAL BONUSES

Earn a lump sum of \$2000 by referring someone to any full-time Erb Company Driver, Owner-Operator & Certified Technician or \$1000 by referring someone to any full-time Erb dock or shunting position!

Applicable to any Erb employee or owner operator with the exception of Human Resources and Management

The referral must be stated by the applicant when specifically asked and recorded by interviewer during the interview process.

The payment will be paid after the referred employee has completed a full two weeks of employment.

All lump sum of \$2000 or \$1000 are after source deductions.



What is your best Erb memory?


Get involved in the Christmas decoration contest. Planning the decoration and decorating the office with my Team - we made it the GingErbread Office!




Since our last report, we have been keeping steady here at Erb Expedite. It has been quite the year so far but as always; we keep on trucking and delivering on our promises.








WOMEN IN THE TRUCKING INDUSTRY

What is it like to be a female truck driver?

Although the trucking industry has traditionally been predominately male, there has been a significant increase of female truck drivers emerging into the industry. Katia Barrette, being one herself, entered the industry in 2018 as a Class 1 long- haul driver. After working in various administrative and office jobs for most of her life, she earned her Heavy Vehicle Driver's License (Class 1) in Quebec one week ahead of her 49th birthday.

She spent 10 years in the real estate market and felt it didn't challenge her enough. Reflecting on her upbringing, she says, "My grandfather used to be a truck driver, and it made me think that it could be a lifestyle I may want. In 2018, I was at a point in my life where I wanted to make a drastic change. I wasn't happy with the life I was leading and decided to switch it up and move into trucking. Today, I don't just love my job at Erb; I adore it."

Road to The Erb Group

At the beginning of her trucking career, she moved through various companies but made the jump to The Erb Group in November 2019. She explained, "I used to work for other companies, and they took advantage of me, especially as a woman. I made a list of truck companies I wanted to work for, and Erb was always on the top. Whenever I met another Erb driver on the road, they always said they'd been at the company for a long time. There are so many transport companies, and they're all hiring. But the fact that people stay a long time at Erb makes it look like they are doing something right."

Women in Trucking

In Canada, women make up 3.5% of Canada's 300,000 truck drivers, according to labor market data from Trucking HR Canada. Katia is one of several female drivers at The Erb Group. She keeps in touch with other female drivers while on the road, through a Facebook group called She Trucking. "I'm very ambitious, and I think that's why I am good at what I do. Sometimes the job is physically hard, like when the axles don't want to budge. But it's our job, so I manage to get it done." Katia continues, "My piece of advice to younger drivers is that it's not all rosy and you need to have thick skin. It takes time to learn how to drive, but if you take it slow, you will succeed. Just have patience and go slow. Your confidence will build over time."



Confidence is Everything

"I've grown in confidence in the last three years, and I feel like a REAL driver. I was doing a delivery in LA a while back and googled what the area looked like ahead of time to ensure I could back in easily. Once I arrived, I realized it was going to be a tight squeeze. The gentlemen guided me into the docking zone, and I parked in one smooth transition. Once they learned I had only been driving for three years; their faces were shocked. They said most drivers refused to back in and made them unload on the street. It made me feel like a champ."

Katia continues, "Another time I had an eagle hit my windshield while driving. I learned to stay calm in tough situations. My previous experience in customer service may have helped me in this area. The windshield completely shattered. I had to transition through different lanes and pull over safely. When I look back on the video footage, I was incredibly calm and confident."

Safety is embedded into The Erb Group's corporate culture, ensuring initiatives and programs are in place across the whole company. The company has been recognized multiple times for being an industry leader, including being awarded TCAs (Truckload Carrier's Association) Fleet Safety Award twice!

Her last piece of advice for anyone sitting on the fence, "It's never too late to make a change. Life is short, and you have to do something that makes you happy. And this job makes me happy."

A VIEW FROM THE **DRIVER'S SEAT**



There is something that every human being possesses regardless of age or whether we have given much or little thought to it. It's called a worldview. It is an outlook on life or a mindset. It is how we perceive and understand the world around us and how our life fits into that world. Granted, a fouryear-old's worldview is not as comprehensive as a 40-year-old's because at that point the child's world is very small, undiscovered, and relatively simple, free from major complexities.

Our worldview is formed by what we learn, what we experience, and how we perceive life on this earth. This then forms the basis of our behavior. The Biblical book of ProvErbs was written a few thousand years ago by a very wise king named Solomon. Listen to how this same truth was stated by him. "For as he thinks within himself, so he is" (ProvErbs 23:7a, NASB).

When I became a born-again believer, I started to read and study God's Word because I realized it was God's revelation of Himself. I wanted to understand the God who saved me and gave me eternal life. Since God created the world and everything and everyone in it, the sensible thing in my mind was to develop a Biblical worldview, so I could see and understand the world I live in, my relationship to this world, and my place in it from God's perspective rather than my own. A Biblical worldview will align your thinking with that of our Creator God by shaping your evaluation of yourself in relation to who God is and what He has done and is doing. This, in turn, determines how you will live in this world He has created. In trucker terminology, the engine of your belief will drive the transmission of your behavior.

On what is your worldview based? How would you articulate your worldview if someone would ask you? I challenge you to read the whole Bible and allow God to form your thinking and your worldview. Find purpose for your life — His purpose!

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A **310T TRUCK** AND COACH **TECHNICIAN APPRENTICE**

Jordan Amstein started his apprenticeship with The Erb Group of Companies in September 2021. We sat down with Jordan at our Sandhills terminal to learn more about his professional growth in the last three months as a 310T Truck and Coach Technician Apprentice.

"I originally started a plumbing job as part of my co-op in high school. But I realized it wasn't for me and started exploring mechanic roles. As a kid, I always worked on fixing our family's snowmobiles and trucks for fun."

Making Another Cool Move

We may be a large company, but we have not forgotten where we started, or that our greatest asset is our people. Jordan explains, "I chose to work for a bigger company as there are more opportunities to learn. I also can work alongside other apprentices, which is nice to talk through tasks with someone who is at the same level as me."

A typical morning for Jordan starts out with performing various services and inspections. No day is the same as a mechanic. "I learned how to pull a transmission, change brakes and fabrication. A fabrication job requires using specialized equipment, such as metal welding or soldering tools to assemble a product."

Career Growth at Erb

"There is a licensed technician in our shop; his name is Justin, and he's always a good person to go to for advice." Jordan reflected on his role and offered advice to anyone interested in being a mechanic. He explains, "to be a mechanic, you need to have a strong work ethic. There is also a lot of physical labour, so you need to be okay with getting dirty."

Jordan has made great strides as an apprentice at Erb. He comments, "I have become very organized in this job. It's important for us to keep our workplace clean and tidy, or else we risk a hazard at work. Being here has instilled top quality safety protocols in my day-to-day job."
